C/21/160 Traffic Safety

The Clerk told the Council that HCC would not allow the payment of the feasibility study to be with the S106 money. HCC has said that use of this money was dependent upon HCC's priorities and that HCC had allocated its use for the High Street. The Clerk explained that £4,000 had already been agreed for the feasibility study from reserves and she asked the Council for a further £6,000. Although the Clerk pointed out that Cllr Foord had a DPI in this matter Cllr Foord did not agree and he gave his opinion. The Council agreed to defer the decision until January so the Cllrs could look at the HCC proposal for the feasibility study (C/21/137).

C/21/161 Parking in Stockbridge with regards HCC's survey

Cllr Boney confirmed the WP had met and had been in agreement that without evidence SPC were not in a position to prove that HCC were wrong in their assertion that parking controls were wanted in Stockbridge. They understood that broadly speaking businesses were against paid parking. It was felt that holding a survey would be an important means of proving the matter. Cllr Lawrence said that Cllr Johnston may be able to help with funding. An online survey may be acceptable for businesses.

ii Cllr Halle asked the Council to re-buff HCC's assertion that parking controls were asked for in Stockbridge. The Council resolved unanimously that the Clerk should write to HCC (Ms Ware's dept) to say that "SPC has neither resolved or requested or supported a decision by HCC to undertake a parking survey and from SPC's own investigations cannot find any in depth support from the Stockbridge traders for the idea, despite claims to the contrary from HCC.
